


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YOUR TOOLS

- Tools were tailored uniquely by each iwi, hapuu, trust, and whaanau.
- Apps now reflect tikanga, methods, and strengths of each group.
- Outcomes went beyond freshwater — because te taiao is interconnected.
- Flexibility created multiple wins for the roopuu.





YOUR TOOLS

Dashboards

- Incorporate diverse datasets (spatial, monitoring, app-based).
- Real-time collection and visualisation.
- Transformational in decision-making and transparency.
- Excitement for workshops to grow capacity and use.

Rongo

- Includes tracking of mauri and maramataka.
- Expanded to include taonga species presence, rongoaa, mahinga kai, and tohu.
- Over 150 observations recorded in recent months.
- Creates long-term value for both roopuu and te taiao, moving toward data equity.




Waikato River

- Funding and resourcing remain the biggest barriers.
- Stakeholders present to witness kaitiaki commitment.
- Stakeholders rely on kaitiaki for maatauranga, advice, and partnerships.
- Tono to stakeholders –
 find ways to fund and
 contract kaitiaki directly
 to enable their mahi.



NO TO NEG-AI - YES TO AI OUTCOMES

- Adoption must be highly targeted and outcome-driven.
- Avoid frivolous or siloed use cases.
- Ensure alignment with Maaori outcomes, reo, maatauranga, and tikanga.
- Focus on affordability and enabling people to fulfil their purpose.









OPPORTUNITIES

- Maaori-led Al means governance and design
- Al tools can be built for Maaori organisations' use.
- Enables Maaori to be navigators, not just observers.
- Positions Maaori as global leaders in ethical Al use.

Now: governance of the sometimes intangible and invisible (AI).

- Requires skillsets that enable governors to manage risks and opportunities.
- Courage is essential to find solutions and create thriving futures, work through barriers.

PROBING PAATAI

- **Self-determination**: Who controls this Al if it uses Maaori knowledge?
- **Guardianship:** Does it restore and protect taonga or exploit them?
- Cultural integrity: Does this this Al uphold tikanga or distort it?
- Collective benefit: Who gains iwi and hapuu or offshore corporations?





TE AO MAARAMA

- Al is the new tide —

- If guided by selfdetermination and tikanga, it can carry us to a thriving future.
